## "Frequency" Language

The following definitions have been adapted from the American Medical Association's <u>Guides to the Evaluation of Permanent Impairment</u>.

## Frequency is described in the following manner:

Intermittent:	When the symptoms or signs occur less than <u>25%</u> of the time when awake.
Occasional:	When the symptoms or signs occur <u>25% to 50%</u> of the time when awake.
Frequent:	When the symptoms and signs occur <u>50% to 75%</u> of the time when awake.
Constant:	When symptoms and signs occur <u>75% to 100%</u> of the time when awake.
