Students in the doctor of chiropractic program, the doctor of naturopathic medicine program, doctor of occupational therapy program, and the doctor of clinical nutrition program are required to adhere to the standard curriculum for their term of enrollment as described in the academic catalog, unless placed on a modified schedule approved by the dean/program director.

Modified Schedules

A student may be placed on a modified schedule under the following circumstances:

- The student has been awarded transfer credit in accordance with university policy; or
- The student requires a modified schedule due to academic standing; or
- The student requires a modified schedule due to an approved accommodation, health-related reason, or other approved extenuating circumstance.

A student may require a modified schedule for one or more academic terms, until such time as the student resumes the standard curriculum for their program as described in the academic catalog.

A modified schedule may not include registration for courses that conflict.

Modified Schedule Tuition

Tuition is assessed each term and is based on the number of enrolled credits, Students in the doctor of chiropractic program, doctor of occupational therapy, and the doctor of naturopathic medicine program may be charged tuition on a per-credit basis when placed on a modified schedule, as described below.

Tuition for students in the doctor of clinical nutrition program is assessed on a per-credit basis regardless of the number of enrolled credits.

Academic Program	Credit-hour Rate	Term Rate
Doctor of Chiropractic	Fewer than 9 quarter credits	9 or more quarter credits
Doctor of Naturopathic Medicine	Fewer than 19 quarter credits	19 or more quarter credits
Doctor of Occupational Therapy	Fewer than 15 semester credits	15 or more semester credits

International Student Course Load

In accordance with U.S. government regulations, international students in F-1 status are required to be registered full-time for each term. Students in F-1 status may be permitted to register for less than full-time status with prior written approval from the dean/program director, following confirmation that the student is eligible for part-time enrollment from the university's primary designated school official (PDSO).

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Satisfactory Academic Progress for Financial Aid Eligibility

Students must meet the requirements set forth in <u>Policy 1218 Academic Standing and Satisfactory Academic Progress</u> to remain eligible for financial aid.
