



Conditional acceptance is granted to applicants who meet the academic admission requirements for a UWS program but are missing one or more required admissions materials (e.g., official transcripts; TOEFL, GRE or MAT test scores; or letters of recommendation). The office of admissions determines academic eligibility for conditional acceptance, specifies the outstanding requirements that an applicant must fulfill, and communicates this information to the applicant.

Students admitted under conditional acceptance must submit all outstanding items prior to the last day of the first term of their enrollment. Students who do not meet this deadline receive a hold on their account and are ineligible to enroll in the next term. Students who fail to enroll due to missing requirements are required to request an approved leave from their academic program in order to maintain continuous enrollment as described in [Policy 1239 Continuous Enrollment, Approved Leave, Involuntary Leave, Withdrawal, Dismissal and Expulsion](#). Students who fail to submit the required materials for an extended period may be dismissed from the university.
