



In accordance with Oregon laws, University of Western States requires full-time on-campus students to meet Oregon state-established vaccination requirements or to provide a legal exemption.

Oregon Measles Vaccination Requirement

Current information on how to satisfy the Oregon measles vaccination requirements can be found in the [UWS Vaccination Process Document](#) and through the [Oregon Health Authority](#). In general, admitted on-campus students born on or after January 1, 1957 are required to demonstrate evidence of receiving the measles vaccine, show evidence of immunity to measles or provide a legal exemption.

Failure to satisfy the Oregon vaccination requirements by the dates listed below may result in registration holds and/or cancellation of enrollment.

Vaccination Due Dates:

Domestic Students. Domestic full-time on-campus students are required to satisfy the Oregon vaccination requirements or provide a legal exemption by the end of their first term of enrollment. Failure of a full-time on-campus domestic student to satisfy the Oregon vaccine requirements by the end of the first term of enrollment may result in a registration hold of their student account, preventing future course registration.

International Students. International full-time on-campus students are required to complete the Oregon vaccine requirements or provide a legal exemption prior to their first term of attendance. International students may not register for or attend classes until these requirements are fulfilled.

Additional Vaccination Requirements

UWS does not require additional vaccinations for participation in educational activities. Some clinical opportunities in health care facilities may have additional vaccination requirements.
